

Letter from the Health Officer

Dear Colleagues, Partners and Friends,

It is my honor to present to you the Bernards Township Health Department's Annual Report for 2020. The Bernards Township Health Department (BTHD) is a contractual public health agency for six municipalities serving nearly 60,000 people in Bernards Township, Bernardsville Borough, and Peapack and Gladstone Borough in Somerset County, as well as Chester Borough, Mendham Borough, and Long Hill Township in Morris County. 2020 was one of the most challenging years our entire world has had to face. During the COVID-19 pandemic the BTHD has continued to provide outstanding public health services and forge meaningful bonds between the staff and municipal colleagues in each of our towns. COVID-19 has taken much away from us, but it did not take away our dedication to our municipalities and the communities we cover.

When I wrote to you in our 2019 Annual Report, I mentioned the emergence of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus. At that point no one could have imagined the year that lay ahead. Businesses and schools closed, masks came on, and the flurry of information from organizations like the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and New Jersey Department of Health) was enough to make any one person's head spin. Our staff remained intact to study the guidance and provide answers to the thousands of questions fielded by the public, schools, our municipal partners, businesses, long term care facilities and first responders. We worked tirelessly for months to make sure no stone was left unturned, and all queries were responded to. Our entire department became cross-trained in communicable disease so that we could accommodate the influx of phone calls and emails. Several of our staff members also became trained contact tracers to help do case investigations for COVID-19 cases. I am so proud of our team coming together at such a critical time to help not only our municipalities but one another.

During 2020 our staff not only excelled in communicable disease investigation, but we continue to provide our typical public health coverage for our towns. This coverage includes Rabies Control, Food and Environmental Services, Health Education and Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN) Education, and Substance Misuse prevention efforts. Our Registered Environmental Health Specialists (REHS or "Inspectors") continued to maintain food inspections, soil logs, septic inspections, and recreational bathing inspections. Guidance for many of these sectors changed day by day and our staff worked hard to study the guidelines offered by the State of New Jersey and inform our community partners. In Health Education, we were able to offer our Annual Influenza Clinics and made many of our programs and meetings virtual to keep our residents safe and informed.

During a pandemic it is easy to feel like so much is out of our control. As your local health department, we are dedicated to ensuring the health and safety of our community. We will continue to work hard on what we can control to keep our residents safe. We have all made so many sacrifices this last year and as our State opens and restrictions begin to loosen, we are beginning to reap the benefits of our hard work. There are many choices for COVID-19 testing and vaccination sites which we did not see a year ago. We are a collective of strong communities that have the power to prevent the spread of disease and work together to keep one another happy and healthy. I thank you for your trust in us this year and we look forward to continuing to serve you and your municipality.

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
MISSION STATEMENT

	COVID-19 MANAGEMENT &
	MITIGATION MONTH BY MONTH
January	 Alerted to a pneumonia outbreak in Wuhan Providence, China on January 9, 2020. Started participating in weekly calls with the New Jersey Department of Health and Centers for Disease Control. Began sending out weekly updates on COVID-19 through email to community partners and newsletter recipients on January 27, 2020.
February	 Staff was trained in the RAVE Alert System to put out alerts to members of the Bernards Township community. Phone call volume began to increase as COVID-19 news began to spread. Employees were constantly on the phone with residents and businesses. Emails began to become constant as well. All employees were cross-trained in COVID-19 guidance as it as released including travel guidance at this point.
March	 Staff were assigned a town each to better serve the schools and town leaders in COVID-19 planning. Worked with Long Term Care Facilities to mitigate COVID-19 spread within facilities. Worked with local school districts and childcare centers while they were opened to safely operate. Worked with those facilities to close and track any cases. Prepared letters to be placed on resident's doors who were diagnosed with COVID-19 and were not able to be reached by phone. These letters were delivered by police.
April	 Staff members were trained in CDRSS (Communicable Disease Reporting Surveillance System) to assist in contact tracing efforts. Developed pandemic literature including a double-sided card with NJDOH Hotline information, "Spread Facts Not Fear" (in English and Spanish), the "Minding Your Health" series including pandemic mental health resources, local resources list, considerations for specific populations (child caregivers, youth, healthcare workers, seniors, etc.) Helped in distributing donated PPE to OEM, Fire, Police and EMS. Began participating in daily NJDOH Office of Local Public Health calls. Staff members created a list of Somerset and Morris County labs, pharmacies and medical offices offering COVID-19 testing. Called locations and gathered information regarding hours, type of testing being offered, turnaround time for results. This list was forwarded to residents upon request.
May	 Staff assisted the VNA for the launch of Commcare contact tracing. Purchased a pro-Zoom account to host Board of Health, Municipal Alliance, and REACH meetings. Began hosting meetings again via Zoom.



	 Switched over to RAVE Alerts to continue to promote weekly COVID-19 updates to nearly 2,500 residents and about 200 municipal stakeholders. Studied guidance daily as things around the state began to reopen. Assisted businesses, gyms, studios, school, and other organizations in hosting safe end-of-the-year programs. Daily Office of Local Public Health calls. Inspectors worked closely with restaurants on re-opening safely outdoors. Worked with youth camps concerning COVID-19 policies. 

CONTACT TRACING COVID-19 CASES

- Typically, communicable diseases are entered into the CDRSS (Communicable Disease Reporting and Surveillance System). Once the disease and patient information is entered, a nurse would reach out for follow up if needed.
- During COVID-19, labs and doctors offices would enter positive COVID-19 cases into CDRSS and our Atlantic Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) nurses would reach out for contact tracing and follow up.
- Eventually, the amount of COVID-19 cases and follow up needs were too great for just CDRSS to contain so Commcare was created as an alternate system for JUST COVID-19 cases and contact tracing.
- All cases first go into CDRSS and then get transferred to Commcare which is where contact tracers pick it up.
- The State of NJ developed a team of contact tracers to aid the Health Departments in case investigation.
- Every effort is made by BTHD staff, VNA Nurses and NJ State contact tracers to investigate every case of COVID-19.

Reaching Informing Supporting Everyone (RISE) Formerly Peer Educators

RISE Peer Educators



- At the end of the 2018-2019 school year, the Peer Educators created the Creative Corner in the WAMS Media Center. This space was developed and designed by the Peer Educators to be a calm down corner, where students could relax, read, color, and reset.
