Community Development Block Grant Application - Community Hope

Community Hope, Inc. seeks \$ 43,264 from Somerset County to maintain the Employment Training Program within the Hope for Veterans® Program. Specifically, the County's support will be used to fund: technology training; identifying each veteran's skill set and area of expertise; counseling veterans on pursing job prospects and establishing connections to employment opportunities. By addressing the need for veterans who have been homeless and unemployed/underemployed to become gainfully employed and acclimated into the workforce before they graduate from the Program, this project enables veterans to graduate on to permanent housing and live independently which are two important goals of the Program.

# Community Development Block Grant Application - Our House

Our House is making application for various handicapped accessibility improvements including kitchen/dining area renovations, laundry area renovations and permits for these improvements.

# **Budget Preview**

Sean McCarthy, CFO presented a preview of the budget to the committee. In summary: the total 2019 budget is \$41,472,873 and will result in a Municipal Tax Levy increase of 1.96% over 2018. Total 2019 appropriations are \$1.8M below our allowable appropriation cap. When applied to this year's average home value, this levy results in an annual increase to the Municipal portion of the tax bill of \$29.78.

Introduction of the budget is scheduled for 3/26/19 with adoption scheduled for 4/23/19.

# USGA's Request to Rezone Adjacent Lands they Acquired from the Pyne Family

Thomas Malman, Esq., representing the United States Golf Association and Ron Kennedy of Gladstone Design presented a request to the committee to consider re-zoning the lands that the USGA acquired from the Pyne family to the Golf Heritage (GH) zone. Those lands are in excess of 100 acres and currently zoned for single family residential development and are contiguous with the USGA's existing facility. The USGA believes it makes sense to include the Pyne property into the GH zone. A diagram from the USGA's master plan showed targeted improvements to the entrance and parking area as well as a golfscape area.

The Committee requested the representatives return on 3/12/19 for continued discussion.

<u>Resolution #2019-0148</u> - In Support of S3320/A4946 Requiring the Director of Division of Fire Safety to Promulgate Regulations Pertaining to Training and Duties of Firefighters Auxiliary Members

WHEREAS, S3320/A4946 grants the Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs the sole authority to promulgate regulations pertaining to the training of Junior Firefighter Auxiliary members and to establish the duties that Junior Firefighter Auxiliary members may perform at training events and emergency scenes; and

WHEREAS, under current law, a person between the ages of 14 and 21 who obtains permission from a parent or guardian may become a member of the Junior Firefighter's Auxiliary; and

WHEREAS, S3320/A4946 reduces the age limit for membership to persons between the ages of 14 and 18; and

WHEREAS, S3320/A4946 requires that permission to participate be granted in a manner required by the Director of the Division of Fire Safety; and

WHEREAS, Junior Firefighter's Auxiliary applicants would be required to submit to a medical examination evaluation; and

WHEREAS, S3320/A4946 limits activities of a junior firefighter who is under the age of 16 to attending Junior Firefighter's Auxiliary Meetings; receiving instructions; certain training activities established by regulations adopted by the director; and observing firefighting activities, while under supervision; and

WHEREAS, under current law, a member of the Junior Firemen's Auxiliary who is under the age of 16 may participate in these activities as well as participate in training that does not involve fire, smoke, toxic or noxious gas, or hazardous materials or substances; and

WHEREAS, S3320/A4946 requires the director to promulgate regulations within 180 days of the bill's enactment; and

**WHEREAS,** S3320/A4946 will empower the Division of Fire Safety to establish regulations pertaining to the training of Junior Firefighter and to establish the duties that Junior Firefighters may perform at training events and emergency scenes.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards that we do hereby support S3320/A4946.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards that copies of this resolution be provided to District 21 Representatives Senator Thomas H.
