# Ordinance of the Township of Bernards

#### **ORDINANCE #2546**

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 3, Police Regulations, Of The Revised General Ordinances Of The Township Of Bernards, To Add A New Section 3-20 Entitled "Resident Protection"

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-1 et seq., the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards is authorized under State law to establish ordinances to preserve the public peace and order; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Bernards, in particular, has seen a disturbing surge in motor vehicle thefts, burglaries, and home invasions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee seeks to adopt the within ordinance to help protect our residents from property, personal, and violent crimes.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the township committee of the township of bernards, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** That Chapter 3 of the Revised General Ordinances, Police Regulations, shall be amended and supplemented to add a new section 3-20 as follows: (new text is in <u>double underline</u>; deletions are <del>stricken</del>):

# §3-20 Resident Protection

# §3-20.1 Purpose and Scope

The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Township of Bernards by establishing certain provisions that are intended to protect the security of the residents in the Township from criminal and intentional activities related to property, personal, and violent crimes.

### §3-20.2 Motor Vehicle Protection

(a) It shall be illegal and a violation of this ordinance for a person to knowingly enter or remain on any private driveway, private parking lot or other location on private property in the presence of a stationary motor vehicle, knowing that they are not licensed or privileged to enter or remain, and commit any of the following acts:

- (1) <u>pull a door handle or take any action in an attempt to open or unlock a motor vehicle that</u> the person does not own or have license or privilege to possess; or
- (2) possess an electronic device that is capable of determining if an electronic key is located inside a motor vehicle.
- (b) It shall be illegal and a violation of this ordinance for a person knowingly to be present inside a motor vehicle if another occupant of the motor vehicle committed a violation of subsection (a) prior to their entry into the motor vehicle.

# §3-20.3 Residence Protection

- (a) It shall be illegal and a violation of this ordinance for a person to knowingly enter or remain on any private property they are not licensed or privileged to enter or remain, and commit any of the following acts:
  - (1) <u>pull a door handle, turn a doorknob, or take any action in an attempt to open, unlock, or gain entry into a house, apartment, garage, or other structure that the person does not own or have license or privilege to enter or remain; or</u>
  - (2) <u>enter any house, apartment, garage, or other structure that the person does not own or have license or privilege to enter or remain.</u>
- (b) <u>It shall be illegal and a violation of this ordinance for a person to be knowingly present inside</u> any house, apartment, garage, or other structure if another occupant committed a violation of subsection (a) prior to their entry into the house, apartment, garage, or other structure.
- (c) It shall be illegal and a violation of this ordinance for a person to be knowingly present inside a motor vehicle if another occupant of the motor vehicle committed a violation of subsection (a) prior to their entry into the motor vehicle.

## §3-20.4 Penalties

- (a) A violation of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a fine of not more than two-thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) or by imprisonment for a term not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, or by a period of community service not to exceed ninety (90) days at the discretion of the judge. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the minimum penalty shall be a fine of one-thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the first offense and two-thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for each subsequent offense.
- (b) Each act that constitutes a violation of this ordinance shall be considered a separate and distinct act that constitutes its own violation.
- **SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY.** If any paragraph, section, subsection, sentence, sentence clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court or administrative agency of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a

separate, distinct and independent provision of such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining paragraphs or sections hereof.

**SECTION 3. INCONSISTENCY.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

### **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT:**

This ordinance amends and supplements Chapter III, Police Regulations, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Bernards to add a new section 3-20 entitled "Resident Protection" to prohibit knowingly trespassing for the purpose of committing a crime, including tampering with or committing the theft or unlawful taking of a motor vehicle, breaking and entering, burglary, and home invasion.

Supporting NJ State Legislature Bill A-3806 and S-2819

Establishing Rebuttable Presumption Of Pretrial Detention And Increasing Penalties For Motor Vehicle Theft Offenses; Authorizing Home Detention For Minors Adjudicated Delinquent For Motor Vehicle Theft Offenses; Establishing Grants For Underage Auto-Theft Risk Deterrence Pilot Program In Juvenile Justice Commission; Appropriating \$7 Million

WHEREAS, there has been a dramatic increase in car thefts and related crimes in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the surge in car thefts has resulted in heightened community fears, financial burdens on victims, and amplified insurance costs, highlighting the multifaceted economic and social repercussions of car theft on the well-being of New Jersey residents; and

WHEREAS, the Bernards Township has been proactive in addressing safety concerns by increasing police resources, adjusting law enforcement activities, enhancing coordination efforts, and advocating for legislative measures to tackle auto theft and related crimes; and

WHEREAS, the rise in car thefts is not confined to Bernards Township, but is a statewide, concern, with similar trends observed across the State, necessitating proactive, statewide measures to curb this alarming trend; and

WHEREAS, Assemblywoman Michele Matsikoudis and Assemblywoman Nancy Munoz have introduced A-3806, and Senator Jon Bramnick has introduced S-2819, aiming to deter motor vehicle thefts by implementing stricter criminal penalties and supporting community-based intervention; and

WHEREAS, A-3806 and S-2819 propose establishment of a rebuttable presumption of pretrial detention for motor vehicle theft offenses. Enhancement of penalties for motor vehicle theft offenses, elevating them to second-degree crimes regardless of the value of the vehicle. Inclusion of motor vehicle theft offenses in the code allowing courts to revoke offenders' driving privileges. Authorization for the court to order home detention for offenders under 18 years old, in addition to other penalties; and

WHEREAS, A-3806 and S-2819 also propose creation of the grants for underage Auto-Theft Risk Deterrence ("GUARD") Program, a \$7 million initiative to support community-based organizations in deterring youth from criminal activities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Bernards Township Committee of the Township of Bernards believe that, with the collective efforts of the State Legislature, law enforcement agencies, and the community, immediate action can be taken to collaboratively address these challenges.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards supports the objectives of A-3806 and S-2819 as introduced and urges the legislature to expedite the review and approval of these bills.; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the members of the New Jersey State Senate, the Lieutenant Governor, the Governor of State of New Jersey, The Assembly Judiciary Committee, and the League of Municipalities.

### **ORDINANCE #2547**

An Ordinance of the Township of Bernards Appropriating \$1,035,000.00 for Various Capital Improvements

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Bernards in the County of Somerset, New Jersey that the sum of \$1,035,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the following purposes:

A	\$310,000.00	Engineering Projects including, but not limited to sidewalk improvements, drainage improvements, and retaining walls.
В	\$725,000.00	Purchase of Motor Vehicle Fleet Replacements including, but not limited to DPW Equipment Vehicles,
		Passenger Vehicles and Trailers

Any grant moneys received for the purposes described above hereof shall be applied to direct payment of the cost of the improvements and shall reduce the amount authorized from the capital improvement fund to the extent that such funds are so used.

The period of usefulness is five years or more. The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.

### **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT:**

This ordinance funds a portion of the 2024 capital items contained in the proposed 2024 Capital Budget that require initiation in order to receive the most competitive bids and to allow the Township to begin necessary repairs and improvements. The remaining Capital requests for Street & Roads, Buildings, Fleet, Fire, First Aid, Engineering, Grounds, Police, Systems Administration, and Parks and Recreation, will be requested after the Budget is adopted.
