Call to Order

Kaitlin Cartoccio called the meeting to order at 6:08 PM. All attendees stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mission Statement

The Mission Statement was read by Kaitlin Cartoccio. The mission of the Bernards Township Municipal Alliance Against Substance Abuse is to provide consultation, programs, training, and resources to members of the Bernards Township community with the goal of preventing and reducing the use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs.

Three goals of the Alliance: ESP!

- 1. To **Educate** about the damaging effects of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs,
- 2. To **Support** events & programs that provide healthy alternatives to substance abuse, and
- 3. To create community wide **Presence** in the identification of problems and in designing effective measurable solutions.

Reports

a. Somerset County Alliance Coordinator (Jennifer Sorenson)

- Jennifer Sorenson could not be at the meeting; Kaitlin gave an update.
- The next Request For Funding (RFA) has been delayed. The funding comes from DEDR Collections (fines and taxes from drug enforcement). These funds are low because of COVID-19, this affects the July 2021-June 2022 year. The funding had been lower for this year and anticipated for next year, and we are not even able to apply for the funding yet.
- In response to the funding frustration, Jennifer Sorenson wrote a letter to the Governor's Council on Alcohol and Drugs.
- The letter was very well received by all the coordinators, it expressed the frustration everyone is feeling regarding the funding calculations.

b. Youth Services Commission

- Ms. Sprague shared her support for the letter and that it represented the concerns for funding very well.
- There were no updates from the County.
- The grant funds for Bernards Township were released and the check will be cut by December 11, 2020. This money represents the funding for REACH and Viking Yoga.
- A second RFP was sent out today. It is for a competitive grant in which only 4 applications were received. It was decided to give some more people a chance to apply. The deadline is January 12, 2021. The objective is to address the disparities caused by COVID. It is worth between \$3,000 and \$12,000.
- The fiscal year is now Jan-Dec. because of the obvious challenges in 2020. It is not clear if this will remain or it will reverse back to Sept-Aug. Assuming a slow transition back to "normal" after COVID and the fact that unspent funds that must be spent to meet reworked goals, it is not likely that the fiscal year will change back soon.

c. Community Program Coordinator

- RFP is on pause.
- Ms. Cartoccio has been meeting with Stephanie Smith, Director of Guidance for Bernards Township Schools and Rebecca Tritt, SAC at RHS. We have \$5,000 from Hackensack-Meridian for a vaping prevention program.

- Originally planning for in-person events (might have to rethink). Perhaps put money towards kids who want to quit vaping. The grant must be used between Jan.'21-Dec'21.
- Ms. Cartoccio has started a partnership with the library. Rachael Talbert,
 Teen Services Librarian, created grab and go bags for certain events. Ms.
 Cartoccio and Ms. Talbert created Holiday De-Stress bags that teens can pick
 up at the library. The bags include stress balls, tips on breathing techniques,
 coloring pages and hot chocolate. All together they made 50 bags for
 students and Bernards Township kids to pick up.

- Alex Timoney gave an update on the leadership meeting with LMTI and how they are trying to rethink events because of COVID. They came up with new areas of interest to plan new events.
